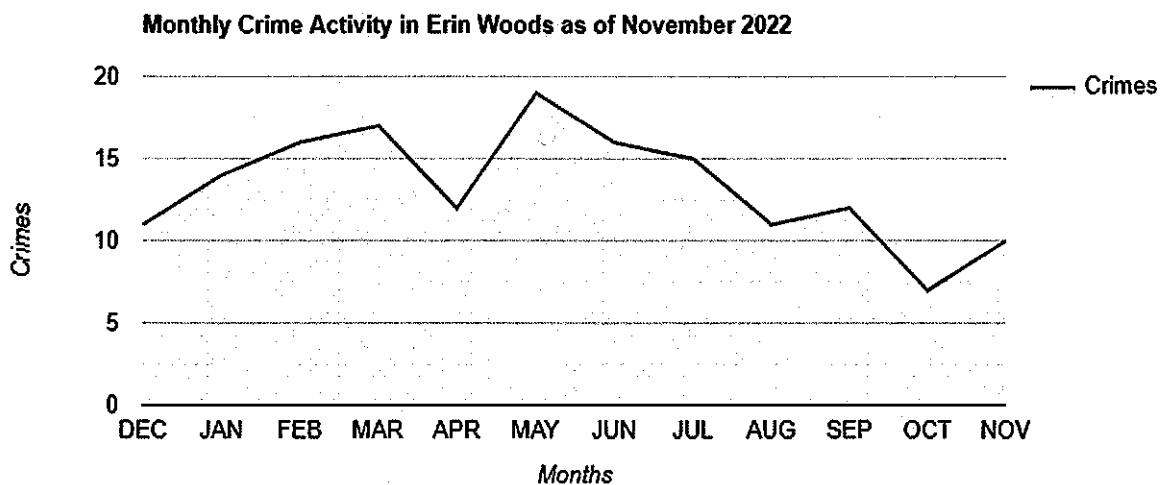

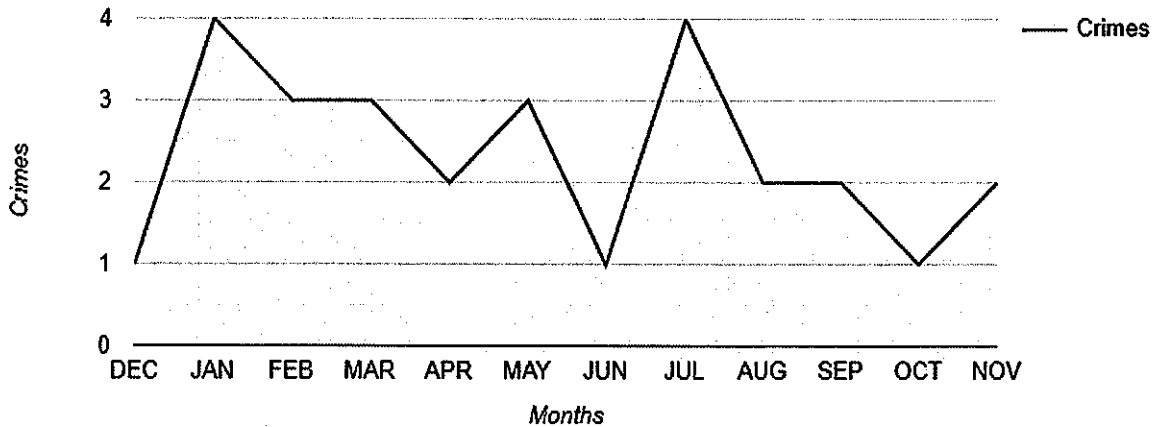
Erin Woods Crime Activity was Up in November 2022

Erin Woods Calgary experienced 10 crimes in November 2022, in comparison to 7 crimes the previous month, and 7 crimes in November one year ago. The Erin Woods community has an average of 13.3 crimes per month. On an annual basis, Erin Woods had a total of 160 crimes as of November 2022, which is up 4% in comparison to 154 crimes as of November 2021. Total Erin Woods community crimes is calculated as the sum of break & enters (dwelling, commercial, and other premises), theft from vehicles, theft of vehicles, assaults (nondomestic), commercial robberies, street robberies, and non-domestic 'other' violence.



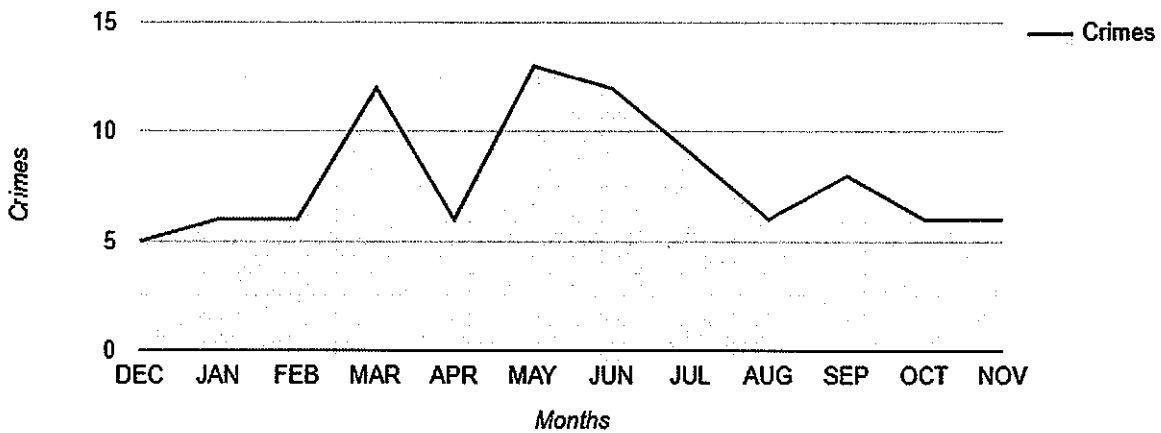
Erin Woods Calgary had 2 break and enter (B&E) crimes in November, in comparison to 1 B&E crime in October and 2 B&E crimes in November 2021. On an annual basis, Erin Woods had a total of 28 B&E crimes as of November 2022, which is up from 27 B&E crimes as of November 2021.

Erin Woods had 6 vehicle related crimes (theft of or theft from vehicles) in November 2022, in comparison to 6 vehicle related crimes in the previous month, and 3 vehicle related crimes in November 2021. On an annual basis, Erin Woods had a total of 95 vehicle related crimes as of November 2022, which is up in comparison to 94 vehicle related crimes as of November 2021.
