MP Update

March 2019

- 1) The SNC-Lavalin scandal is the biggest issue facing Ottawa at the moment. Tom and the Conservative caucus is spending their time trying to get to the heart of who was putting pressure on Jody Wilson-Raybould to reverse her decision on denying a remediation agreement to SNC-Lavalin. Mrs. Raybould testified at the Standing Committee on Justice that she did face pressure and attempted political interference. As a result of this scandal, Gerald Butts, Principle Secretary to the Prime Minister, resigned. Also, President of the Treasury Board, Jane Philpott, resigned from cabinet citing a lack of confidence in the current government.

Tom had the opportunity to put forward another Private Member's Bill. This Bill would establish a national Rare Disease Day on the last day of February every year. This is in hopes to raise awareness for rare diseases across Canada and let those in the rare disease community know that we are with them. He also hosted a flag raising ceremony in recognition of International Rare Disease Day along with MPs from other parties.

- 2) Tom has had the chance to attend several events in the riding recently. He attended the Calgary Public Library opening in Seton, spoke at Dr. George Stanley School, attended a Citizenship Ceremony in Riverbend, toured the Women in Need Society and spoke with constituents on a variety of issues.

He will be speaking to more students in the riding this month, attending the grand opening of Joane Cardinal-Schubert High School in Seton and speaking on immigration at a panel discussion hosted by the Calgary Catholic Immigration Society.
