Electronic Motions Between March and April Board Meetings:

- a) Electronic Motion of March 18, 2018:
Lucky Kaur moved to change the contract with our service provider from Tyco/Simplex to PDS. Seconded by Denise Buteau. Motion carried.
- b) Electronic Motion of March 29, 2018:
Denise Buteau moved that we purchase speakers at Costco for \$200.00 plus GST approx. Seconded by Lynda Schentag. Motion carried.

Adoption & Signing of March 12, 2018 general meeting Minutes:

Denise Buteau moved to approve the minutes of the March 12, 2018 meeting as corrected along with the addition of the two electronic motions. Anne Miller seconded. Passed.

Reports to Board and related business:

1. *CPS Community Resource Officer* – Constable Cindy Robinson: Crime Stats
 - a) Crime stats for March, 2018:

 - b) There is a house in Erin Woods that will be fenced by Safer Communities and Neighbourhoods (SCAN).
 - c) Discussion re:

2. NPC – Rob Dickinson: Report from City of Calgary

a) Rob circulated three attached bulletins:

- Outdoor Rink Volunteer Appreciation Networking Event!
- 2018 FREE guided cemetery tours – May 27 to October 28
- Home Improvement Project Open House

b) Question about City buildings as assets:

- The City does not record community association buildings as assets, so they are not recorded from a financial perspective. Some community partners are included on the City insurance policy in specific cases where their lease/LOC does not yet state property insurance requirements.
- Lori later noted that the building is on our balance sheet but it's owned by the City so we need to settle this issue.
- Rob will tighten up the response on the asset of the building and report back.

c) Census:

- Census began April 2. Calgarians can provide their census information on line at Calgary.ca/census. Access codes were delivered starting April 3. If a resident does not receive an access code, has technical difficulties or has questions about the census on line, they can call 403-476-4100. Assistance is also available after hours through 3-1-1.

d) Basketball Clinic:

- It may be either a 3on3 tournament or a skills competition. Programmers will let us know what they decide.
- Possible dates are June 30 or August 18. The Board prefers August 18.

e) Community Garden:

- Angie is away.
- Rob stated that we are looking at a start next year.
- He is available for a meeting.

f) Discussion re Future of Community Association Buildings:

- Rob advised that the buildings provide a space for programs (meeting rooms etc.) but it's not necessary to have a building as many programs take place outside.
- Some Community Associations are in need of repair that isn't feasible.
- The future of Community Association buildings will be presented later by Eric.

g) Financials:

- Financials have been flagged for concern re sustainability.
- The January 31, 2017 numbers are better showing a net loss of approximately \$13,000.00.
- The January 31, 2018 year has an estimated loss of approximately \$44,000.00.
- We may need outside help with our business plan. We need to target a few key places that we want to work on.
- They will look at where the money is coming from for operating expenses.
- The new Board requires orientation regarding their responsibilities and liabilities.
- We need to focus on how to get the future stable and how the City can help.

- h) Summer Programs
 - Denise asked about Summer Programs. Rob noted that time slots are being finalized and he will let us know.
 - Discussion around Valleyview Park being an excellent park for families. Rob will check to see what group was leading the park. Some of the park's programming may have been attached to Dover Community Association.

3. *Ward 9 Constituency Assistant – Blair Hone: Report from Councillor Carra's office*

- a) Blair Hone was absent. Eric attended on behalf of Councillor Carra.
- b) Book marks:
 - Book marks listing Phone Numbers To Know were distributed.
- c) Return tax money to taxpayers:
 - Council voted to return to the taxpayers approximately \$6,000,000.00 of tax money that was returned to the City from the Provincial Government.
- d) Budget:
 - Budget is coming up in November when the City will be talking about the next year and the next four years.
- e) Cannabis:
 - Council voted on regulations regarding Cannabis use.
 - Council passed a bylaw restricting the public consumption of non-medicinal cannabis.
 - Council balanced extensive public health evidence with personal freedoms (the right to use with the right to not be affected by others' usage).
 - Public use areas are being investigated.
 - Debate:
 - It's smoking so why can't they have the same rules as smoking?
 - It's considered an intoxicant and should be treated like alcohol.
 - The City acknowledges the concerns and has listened to the people.
 - Council will try to establish norms around it since it's becoming legal.
 - The City will be strict to start, and then revisit it in a year.
 - When the norms are established, they can start relaxing the bylaw.
 - Until the bylaw comes into effect, it's still underground and has been illegal a long time.
 - It will be legal in August and the Bylaws will come into effect so we will learn what works.
 - Every walk of life uses Cannabis.
- f) Olympic Bid Proposed Public Engagement Approach
 - The Olympic Bid Proposed Public Engagement Approach report will be presented to council on April 10 to the Priorities and Finance Committee.
 - A potential timeframe to hold a plebiscite has been included.
 - Discussion took place as to whether or not the City should hold a plebiscite.
 - Eric advised that Gian-Carlo asks:
 - Do the Olympics turn a profit?
 - Are we able to build on our Olympic legacy?
 - Are we able to shorten the time so that we can improve infrastructure?
- g) Public Art Process Review
 - The City wants your input as they work to improve the implementation of the public art policy.
 - Any project (including art) that is above \$75,000.00 must go for tender as per NAFTA.

- This means that Calgarians can also have the opportunity to bid on projects internationally.
 - Discussion relating to various City art projects (e.g. the Peace Bridge).
 - Eric advised that the Peace Bridge is the most recognized bridge in North America.
 - It is the most recognized feature in Calgary.
 - This has made us known around the world.
 - Everyone has a different perception of the purpose of public art.
 - To provide your input, you can take the survey at <https://engage.calgary.ca/public-art-NOM>

President's Address-Lori:-

The City of Calgary and Councillor Chabot's office have been working with EWCA through the traffic calming committee and an open house was held last summer to assess the support from the community for going forward with the TC plan. Since most were in favour, the project went forward, and we now have various temporary devices installed throughout EW you are all familiar with by now, with resulting reductions in speeds being recorded by City staff. This past weekend the City again solicited feedback on the project, with the bonus that they also created a unique event for our residents whereby everyone was allowed to paint the pavement with their own artwork, on the North side of Erin Woods Blvd. EWCA and the City will be doing 'part two' on the South side of the Blvd on June 17th, as part of a Neighbour Day celebration, so be sure to come out for that. Your Board has also worked with the Federation of Calgary Communities and some U of C Urban Studies students on a project to identify various areas around Erin Woods that people either enjoy or avoid, and we are in the process of developing strategies for dealing with or highlighting these identified areas. There will be another open house here on Monday, May 29th, hosted by the Federation, so be sure to drop by and check it out. Also this year, we have been worked on strengthening our communications with the neighbourhood, and having more of a presence on social media.

- ✓ Developed and implemented a Budget
- ✓ Worked with SCAN, CPS, and community members to deal with a long-time 'problem house', and it is currently being boarded up for three months
- ✓ Participated in many Bingos throughout the year to raise community funds
- ✓ Communicated and collaborated with other CAs and local service organizations and community groups on matters of mutual importance
- ✓ Dealt with Planning and Development applications and issues as necessary, with input from the relevant stakeholders
- ✓ Held one 'Paint the Pavement' event in conjunction with the City of Calgary last May, when we were doing the 1st-year community feedback on the Traffic Calming Project.
- ✓ Held another 'Paint the Pavement' event on Neighbour Day in June, with Bouncy house, games, prizes, and other fun stuff in Erin Woods Park
- ✓ We had our annual Stampede Stomp pancake breakfast, with entertainment, music, clown, and games (with thanks to the Scouts team leaders for flipping the flapjacks!)
- ✓ Held a Fall Fun Nite event with games, glitter tattoos, dancing, and pizza
- ✓ Despite a few snags, we pulled off the yearly Clean Up Day in September
- ✓ With much help from the Champion Life Centre on 52nd St, we put on an amazing Christmas Party for the kids, with Santa, hot chocolate, crafts, glitter tattoos, and rides around the Park on a two-horse drawn carriage
- ✓ Numerous Seniors' Teas were held, with great snacks, guest speakers, and much mingling and socializing happening
- ✓ We are "this close" to launching our new EWCA Website - details coming soon!
- ✓ We are facilitating the process to hopefully get enough residents committed to creating a Community Garden
- ✓ We have completed many needed repairs and maintenance at the Hall, including mould remediation in the Shed; new sidewalks and steps poured; lighting repairs and upgrades in the parking lot; and new downspouts, which are all part and parcel of the myriad responsibilities in the running of this building

- ✓ We are working with the City on the latest Hall Lifecycle Study, which identifies any Hall issues as well as future items that will need to be funded and dealt with.
- ✓ Built and installed both a Little Free Library, and Little Free Pantry outside the Hall, for the use of all Erin Woodians, and they are both very popular!
- ✓ Maintained a presence on Facebook, and used it to reach out to the community on various issues, events, and information
- ✓ Continued with other ongoing programs at the Hall including Scouts, Dart League, and Martial Arts classes
- ✓ Put on the kids' soccer program
- ✓ Re-started the Slo-pitch program
- ✓ Held a number of Jelly Bean Dances for the younger kids
- ✓ Sent our EWCA representative to the ECTAS Board meetings throughout the year, where we exercise our shareholder right to vote on ECTAS business
- ✓ We regularly liaised with the relevant political representatives at the Municipal and Federal levels on issues of concern, and they in turn attended our meetings from time to time
- ✓ We continued to work on the Traffic Calming Project, which is coming up later this year for the two-year evaluation wrap-up phase, when EWCA and community members decide what's working and what is not and provide our feedback to the City
- ✓ Have worked on maintaining our status to participate in Casinos, and will doing our next one soon, on June 16th and 17th
- ✓ Last Christmas, we helped to get food hampers to Erin Woods residents who needed them

The City of Calgary – Preparing for flood season

With a higher-than-average snowpack, overland flooding affecting several Alberta communities and the five-year anniversary of the 2013 Southern Alberta flood, we know that river flooding is top-of-mind for Calgarians. It is our priority at the City of Calgary to monitor, manage and reduce flood risk, and to ensure citizens understand their risk and have the resources available to prepare.

River flooding impacts all Calgarians who live, work, commute or recreate in the city centre or along the Bow and Elbow Rivers. River flooding is most likely to occur between May 15 and July 15. We actively monitor river, weather and snow pack conditions to prepare for potential flooding. It is important to note that:

- Heavy rainfall upstream of Calgary has the biggest influence on river flood risk. These events are challenging to forecast because we are so close to the mountains. We can sometimes see potential rain events 5 to 7 days ahead, but by the time we know how high river flows may be, we may have less than 24 hours to respond appropriately.
- A high snowpack alone can cause high flows, but does not cause our rivers to flood. The snowpack in the mountains has been higher than average this year, however, lower spring temperatures in the mountains means the snow is melting slower than on the prairies, where snowmelt is causing flooding in other municipalities.
- The City and Province continuously monitor for conditions that can develop into flood events.

Since 2013, together with the Province, we have committed more than \$150 million towards projects that will reduce our risk of river flood damage. We have also strengthened our understanding of the flow of the Bow and Elbow Rivers, how rivers change, flood modelling, forecasting, preparedness and response.

While we are working to reduce our risk of river flood damage, we cannot eliminate the risk of flooding entirely. Citizens have a critical role to play in preparing for river flooding.
