#### Board Items

*CPS Community Resource Office – Constable Miguel Lay*

#### 1. Community Update

- a. Crime Stats: Social & Physical Disorder stats are no longer calculated, though there's no insight on this for Miguel. Miguel believes this is due to stats going higher than anticipated. All other stats of have gone down except for Crimes of Opportunity (i.e. theft FROM vehicle).
- b. Homeless Camps: Had a meeting with bylaw services regarding homeless situation in Calgary – affecting all communities by way of campers, which is happening in clusters all over the city. Have been fielding bylaw calls for these homeless camps.
  - i. DI, Mustard Seed, Alpha House, etc. are also under the social distancing limitations and have decreased capacity by 60% while adhering to provincial policies and are not working collectively together. If guests have not accessed facilities within the previous 14-days these guests are turned away. This has left no location for CPS to take guests, and no resources to utilize to provide the homeless aid.
  - ii. Two homeless teams are being cut down to one. 1,900 calls total in 2019, so far in 2020 there have been 1,800, prior to winter hitting. Anticipating malls, transit, etc. will be inundated with the cold weather. Anticipating an excess of the 1-2 deaths seen in previous years.
  - iii. **What does the EWCA see as a solution for this?** City Counsel won't take a stand for or against, and there are no tools or resources made available to CPS – on a City or Provincial level. Petition the community as an association to identify action. Possibly look at including EW residences who are recovered from addiction in this initiative.



- c. 146 Erin Woods Circle: was visited due to a stolen vehicle and plate at the house. They are moving out, and CPS (Miguel) is addressing this one house at a time. SCAN will continue to be dispatched to problematic Erin Woods houses, and are active in Dover as well.
- d. Crimes of Opportunity: with the cold weather remind residents to not leave valuables in vehicle, keep items hidden, and report suspicious activity.
- e. Crime Panel Livestream: alternative options are opening questions to the community and having Miguel answer either on a case-by-case basis to be included in EWCA update, or at a livestream/panel. Can possibly be in conjunction with ECTAS and be held in their lounge (maximum capacity w/ COVID is 84 people).
- f. Board Question: regarding the rash of thefts by 7/11s and Petro, Corey was curious as to if this has been managed and addressed. Miguel provided insight that these "swarmings" have been addressed. The School Resource Office for the Junior High has been reviewing pictures. Limiting number of customers has not been effective as only the "good kids" have been leaving bags / respecting the laws. Due to COVID and capacity issues many petty theft criminals are regularly released back into their communities.

  - a. Formal Request for communities that have been successful in the Community Watch initiatives. Rob communicated to Lois that Coventry (Northern Hills Community Association website) has great resources for this.

AGMs/Annual Return Filing Deadline UPDATE	<p>As you may recall, in April 2020, the Government of Alberta suspended deadlines for corporations, partnerships, cooperatives, and non-profit organizations to hold annual general meetings and file their annual returns. Earlier this week, the Government of Alberta <u>announced</u> that the temporary order suspending these deadlines has been lifted.</p> <p>Corporations, partnerships, cooperatives and non-profit organizations are now required to hold their Annual General Meetings (AGMs) sometime after August 14, depending on the date the AGM was scheduled for before being postponed due to COVID-19.</p> <p>Annual return filing timelines were <b>reinstated as of August 15</b>, and organizations who delayed filing, must now file their annual returns after holding their AGM.</p> <p>For partners in the non-profit sector, <a href="#">IntegralOrg</a> has created the resource guide, <a href="#">Alberta Nonprofits and AGMs</a>, to provide more information about the requirements that have been reinstated.</p>
